FEDERAL OFFICES

US President & Vice President are the two highest constitutional offices in the executive branch. The President directs the federal government's executive branch and is the commander-in-chief of the US Armed Forces. Vote to direct electors from Colorado.

2020 President/Vice President of the US: Vote for one pair

- (D) Joseph R. Biden/Kamala D. Harris (former Vice President, 2008–2016)
- (R) Donald J. Trump/Michael R. Pence (incumbent, elected 2016)

US Senate is one of the two parts of the legislative branch and is made up of two senators from each state. There are 100 US senators in total. A senator's term of office is six years, and approximately one-third of the Senate's total membership is *elected every two years*. The US Senate confirms the appointments of the President by a majority vote.

2020 Colorado US Senate:

US House of Representatives is one of two parts of the legislative branch. Representatives draft and approve federal laws. There are 435 congressional districts across the 50 states, and they are determined based on population.

STATE OFFICES

Colorado State Board of Education is an elected executive agency responsible for managing Colorado's public kindergarten through grade twelve (K–12) education. The state board of education districts are split up by congressional district.

Colorado State Senate has 35 Senators that are elected every four years from the district in which they live.

University of Colorado (CU) Board of Regents oversees general administration and directs all funds appropriated to CU.

The **Colorado District Attorney** is the prosecuting officer of a criminal case. A DA represents the state government in the prosecution of criminal offenses. DA's run to serve as the prosecuting officer in one of Colorado's 22 judicial districts.
